**DEPARTMENT REPORTS**



**OTHER BUSINESS**

- Mayor Logan: 1. Village received their Tree City Award and got a promotional DVD put together by Conneaut. Will make copies available.  
2. Harper Street storm water project on tract.  
3. J. Loiacono had a heart attack but is doing well.  
4. Storm water quarterly meeting has not been scheduled.  
5. Will get cost difference with going to 12 hour shifts.  
6. Planning Commission will meet on 7/6 to discuss Internet Café's.
- P. Cassella – 1. Income tax increase is most effective way of increasing revenue.  
2. Having both income tax increase and Road & Bridge on ballot could bring about confusion. In favor of only income tax on ballot for November. J> Young and G. Schultz agree. M. Glover and B. Shimko want to keep both on ballot.  
3. Newsletter will go out about ballot issues. Last newsletter was sent bulk and some residents did not receive it. Everything is on the website.
- L. Hofer: 1. Received millage to put \$400,000 police levy on ballot. Perry Village – 11.45 mils.  
Perry Village and Perry Township – 1.96 mils, all three Perry's - .82 mil
- V. Stevens: 1. Went to the school board meeting and demolition is to start in 2 weeks.
- T. Gande: 1. Status of addition to police garage. (Not being done)
- D. Routzahn: 1. Instead of doubling income tax should merge with other communities.  
2. Madison Township Police budget is \$2,000,000 and covers larger area.


3. Look into regional police department. (Need interest from contiguous areas.)
